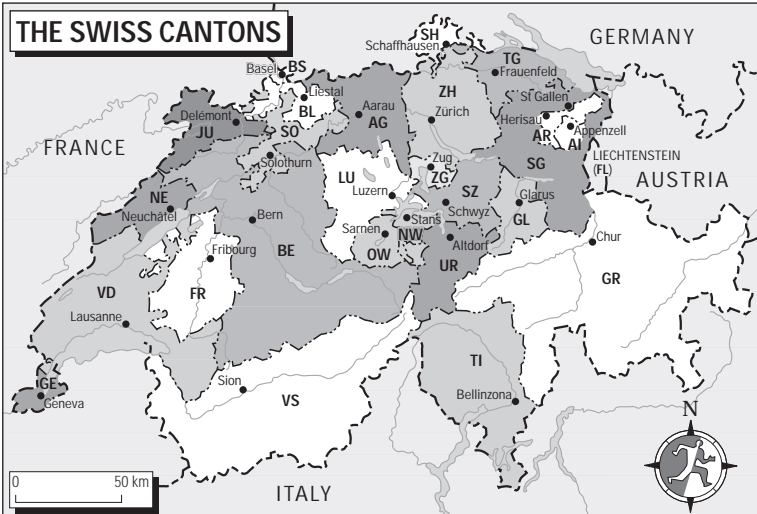


THE SWISS CANTONS
